Davida Martin Adrian Smith Shawn Willis









Davida and her siblings grew up with a focus on education. It was their parents' firm belief that education is the key to success. The basics were essential. That included showing up for school everyday, completing homework assignments, being on your best behavior in school, being respectful toward others, especially teachers, and doing our best.

When Davida was twelve years old, the family moved from Lexington, NC to Winston-Salem for their father to attend law school at Wake Forest University; he was 38 years old. It was her first exposure to an integrated school. While she suffered many abuses, she fought back by excelling academically. Her hard work was rewarded with many academic honors, including a Presidential Scholarship to North Carolina A&T State University. Meanwhile, Davida had met and fallen in love with Harold Martin. They were both serious about their studies and supportive of each other in the journey. Harold was a student at A&T as well.

It soon became an expectation by Davida's parents that each child would add a "D" to their name as their father put it. That meant each was expected to earn an MD, PhD or JD degree. Despite one sibling threatening to simply change her name to add a "D", they all eventually complied.



Davida chose law school. She graduated from Wake Forest University School of Law exactly ten years after her father completed the same law school. She practiced law with her father for five years before branching out on her own. Four years later, she joined the Forsyth County Attorney's Office and ultimately became the first African American woman to be appointed County Attorney in the State of North Carolina, a position which she held for twenty years.

Davida and her husband, Harold, are proud of their two sons. And yes, they do have a "D" behind their names.

All eyes are now on the next generation.

Just as Davida's parents provided the inspiration and motivation to encourage success, Junior Achievement of the Triad programs pour knowledge and skills into our youth to guide them toward future academic and economic success.



Adrian is the CEO of Ice Age Management, Inc., which owns and operates several McDonald's franchises in North Carolina, South Carolina, and Southwest Virginia. In 1995, after graduating from Florida A&M University with his BS in Business Administration, Adrian moved to Greensboro, NC and began working with his parents in their 3 McDonald's franchises.

He immediately entered the Franchisee program and was approved as a McDonald's Franchisee in December 2000. In September of 2004, Adrian purchased his first McDonald's in Eden, NC and continued to operate his parent's restaurants.

In subsequent years, Adrian acquired several more McDonald's restaurants and continued to build his company and its infrastructure. Today, Ice Age Management, Inc. owns and operates 50 McDonald's restaurants.

Adrian serves and has served on several local and national boards. He currently serves on American National Bank Board, GTCC Foundation Board, National Black McDonald's Owner's Association, McDonald's OpNad Board, Greensboro Sports Foundation, UNCG Board of Visitors, and Ronald McDonald House Children's Charities of Chapel



Hill Board. He has also has served on Greensboro Merchant's Association, Greensboro Chamber of Commerce, Greensboro Parks and Recreation, Triad Stage and Community Theater.

Adrian lives in Summerfield, NC with his daughter, Maya (16). Adrian also has two older sons, Mason (21), and Andrew (27).



Shawn Willis, the owner / operator of Chick-fil-A in Burlington was born and raised in Birmingham, Alabama. He completed his education at the University of Alabama, Birmingham, earning a Bachelor of Science in Social Work. Initially embarking on a career in social work, Shawn later transitioned to a leadership role with a local department store.

In pursuit of additional income, Shawn took on a part-time position at Chick-fil-A, setting the stage for a remarkable 27 -year journey with the franchise. His inaugural restaurant in Vero Beach, Florida, opened in 1996 within a mall setting. Relocating to Charlotte, NC, in 1999, Shawn established a standalone street restaurant. In 2004, an opportunity arose in Alamance County, prompting Shawn to move his family to Burlington, where he has dedicated two decades to serving the local community.

Throughout his tenure with Chick-fil-A Inc., Shawn actively participated in various teams contributing to areas such as Innovation, Digital Transformation and Diversity, Equity & Inclusion (DE&I). Moreover, Chick-fil-A Inc. provides franchisees, like Shawn, the chance to engage in teaching servant leadership on an international scale. Leveraging these opportunities, Shawn had the honor of imparting servant leadership principles to hundreds of 10

individuals in Uganda over the course of seven years.

Uganda holds a special place in Shawn's heart, having visited the country nine times. Beyond teaching, he actively supports an orphanage, babies' home, school, and a farm fostering a deep connection with the Ugandan culture.

In addition to leading his organization, Shawn is deeply committed to community service. He currently serves on The Salvation Army Advisory Council where he has been an integral part of their success for the last five years. Shawn supports the Alamance-Burlington School System by serving on the Career and Technical Education Advisory Board and was a member of the Business Advisory Board for Cummings High School in Burlington, NC for many years. Shawn has even done a stint with Junior Achievement, teaching Personal Finance in local high schools.

Beyond his professional and community engagements, Shawn is a devoted follower of Jesus Christ, a commitment he has upheld for over 40 years. Married to his lovely wife, Lori, for 33 years, they are parents to four grown children. Together they find the most joy in their favorite pastime – nurturing close relationships with their eight grandchildren.
